## **Cambridge Street School visit Parliament**



**PUPILS FROM** Cambridge Street School in Batley took a trip down to London to visit the Houses of Parliament as part of their Citizenship studies. Whilst there, as well as a tour of the building, they also met with their local member of parliament Tracy Brabin MP.

Pupils from the school give an account of their day below:

When we arrived we entered a huge hall which is the oldest part of the parliament which managed to survive the great fire in 1834.

We started our tour in a hall that was featured in the movie Harry Potter.

"There, two tour guides showed us around and how the main hall was used for

great personalities to give inspirational speeches such as Nelson Mandela and Barack Obama.

The tour was quite fascinating.

At around 2:30 pm we witnessed the speaker and the sergeant of arms walking into the House of

Commons. This is a tradition that has been taking place for many years and even today every day at the same time this procession takes place.

Whilst the march was taking place it was pin drop silence and all officers must remove their hats for respect.

Then we entered reception area which used to be the place where the MP's

used to talk about important issues. Later on in the day, we attended a workshop and we watched a video about the suffragettes and how they won the right to vote after years of campaigning."

After that, we met with our MP, Tracy Brabin. She talked to us for a little while and then we got a chance to ask her questions. This was very insightful as we learnt how busy the day of an MP could be and what drove Tracy herself to becoming an MP.

Finally, at the end of our time in London, we went to see the River Thames and the London Eye. After that we ate our lunch and headed to the gift shop."
